


What is your age?






Are you an employee of the District?








How do you like to receive school/District information?





Would you support the District exploring a capital (facilities) referendum?




Would you support a \$122.9 million referendum to fund the recommended plan? (*Resident Staff*)






Would you support a \$122.9 million referendum to fund the recommended plan? (*Resident Parents*)




Would you support a \$122.9 million referendum to fund the recommended plan? (Resident Non-Parent/Non-Staff)



What did we learn?

- A plurality of all subgroups support the District exploring a capital (facilities) referendum.
- The \$122.9 million referendum had a weighted support of 43.5%. Therefore, it would not likely be supported at this time.
- Some respondents questioned the necessity of building a new middle school and others would like more information.
- Some respondents shared comments on the importance of preparing students for jobs (e.g. agriculture, the trades, and engineering).



Next Steps:

- Consider developing a plan to address the most urgent maintenance needs at the middle school to extend the service life for at least 5 years. This could be funded through an operational referendum.
- Consider focusing on the preliminary plan to improve the high school tech. ed. (shop) areas to better prepare students for jobs in agriculture, manufacturing, construction, and engineering. This would likely require funding through a capital referendum.






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Financial Planning Background


The District's share of local property taxes is calculated using a mill rate. As seen in the chart below, the tax mill rate has dropped by more than 34% since the 2013-14 school year. In addition, the Board paid down current debt, saving more than \$3.3 million in future interest expenses.





The District's current mill rate is below the state average and one of the lowest in our area.

Facility Planning Background

The facility plan was approved by the Board of Education last year after more than a year of research and several community input sessions. This process identified three primary challenges.

School Capacity

Based on enrollment projections, the elementary schools will be nearing capacity in three years. It is important to note that it will take two years after a referendum is approved before school construction is completed and additional space is available.

Enrollment Growth

The City of Reedsburg is the fastest-growing community in Sauk County. A recent enrollment study projected that 1,200 housing units will be built over the next ten years.

Aging Educational Spaces

Teaching and learning have changed significantly since many of our schools were built. Today's classrooms need to support:

- Student collaboration and small-group instruction.
- Hands-on learning in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM).
- Project-based learning.

To address these challenges, local voters would need to approve a capital referendum.
