- ★ RAHS Composite ACT Score of 22.0.



Career Pathways and Work-Based Learning

Career Pathways and Work-Based Learning opportunities are intended to equip students and their families with the tools and experiences necessary to make more informed choices about **postsecondary education**, **training**, **and careers for life after high school**.

Postsecondary Education and Training can include, but not be limited to:

- Technical College
- Adult Apprenticeships
- Industry Certificated Programs
- On-the-job Training Programs
- Military Service
- Four-Year Colleges and Universities

Career Pathways and Work-Based Learning

Our Charge: Develop new career pathways and build a phased timeline for implementation, including work-based learning opportunities and a more coordinated use of our career planning program.

Our Team: RAHS Administrators, Career & Technical Education Teachers, Counselors, Central Office Administrators

Current Pathways

- Manufacturing
- Automotive
- Construction
- Culinary Arts/Tourism

Pathways we are exploring:

- Engineering (including a potential Fab Lab)

Career Pathways and Work-Based Learning Career Pathways Software: Xello

- Students complete interactive career, personality, and learning style assessments to help them better understand their unique interests, skills, and strengths. This work begins in middle school.
- Students explore hundreds of career and post-secondary options that align with their assessment results. Students are able to save these options.
- Students translate their knowledge into an actionable plan by analyzing their saved career and post-secondary options and matching them to RAHS course offerings to create an academic and career plan.
- This work will be done school-wide, involving all staff in the pathways process.



Career Pathways and Work-Based Learning

Youth Apprenticeship Programs:

- The Department of Workforce Development (DWD) administers the program.
- School-based and work-based learning are integrated.
- Youth apprentices work on industry established skills standards.
- Youth apprenticeships are considered a "capstone" experience as part of a career pathway.
- Youth apprentices are paid at least minimum wage.
- One-year youth apprentices complete a minimum of 450 hours.
- Two-year youth apprentices complete a minimum of 900 hours.



Collaborative Practices

Why use collaborative practices?

<u>Research shows</u> that educational experiences that are active, social, contextual, engaging, and student-owned lead to deeper learning. The benefits of student collaboration include:

- Development of higher-level thinking, oral communication, self-management, and leadership skills.
- Promotion of student-faculty interaction.
- Increase in student retention, self-esteem, and responsibility.
- Exposure to and an increase in understanding of diverse perspectives.
- Preparation for real life social and employment situations.

Students working collaboratively is one of the powerful practices <u>(The Great Eight)</u> Robert Marzano and John Hattie agree help students achieve better results.



Collaborative Practices

Two of the top three areas where employers want more—soft skills and team effectiveness-have collaboration at their core. Between employees wanting more collaboration and employers making it a focus, your company (school district) could miss out on (educating) top talent (all students) by neglecting collaboration. 










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







Simplified Destinations & Naming for Community Input







Key Takeaways from February 1st Workshop

- The presentation to the community is critical to address preconceived notions while sharing what matters most in a simplified manner—careful use of language and words that speak neutrally and factually as possible.
- When communicating, use the key talking points whenever possible to maintain clear and consistent messaging among our entire team.
- We must prepare for questions about Webb Middle School and any confusion about the differences between our current planning work and referendum projects.
